Thanks to the amazing generosity of 24 sponsors, many of whom have supported the last seven Teachers of the Year events, bidders on 96 auction items and 60 donors to KidsRead, the **Osborn School District Educational Foundation (OSDEF)** netted **\$60,012.62**—down from last year, but we remain grateful. - **Twenty-four generous Sponsors who donated a total of \$63,000.**
- **Generous Silent Auction Bidders on items valued at \$20,959, raising \$14,009.**

- **Requests for Funding (RFF)** are awarded for innovative teacher, grade level, school or district level programs in amounts in excess of \$500 with no top cap. Fall program awards are for implementation during the spring; spring program awards are for implementation the following fall.



We also provide funds to principals and the superintendent to support special events and activities for which funds are not normally available—for example, the opening meeting breakfast and refreshments for staff development

FALL TEACHER MINI-GRANTS APPROVED


The OSDEF Board recently approved 24 Teacher Mini-Grants totaling \$10,573. All schools received funding. Most approved grants included materials that can be used to enrich student learning for multiple years. Examples of approved projects include:

- **A set of microscopes** — Clarendon
- **A set of novels for class discussion** — Longview
- **Writing/Language Support Materials** — Montecito Montessori
- **Chef Knives for Culinary Education** — Child Nutrition
- **Computer Controlled Cutting Machine (Cricut) to design and create ELL Materials** — Osborn Middle
- **Noise Canceling Headphones** — Clarendon

FALL MINI-GRANTS ALREADY IN ACTION

Michelle Megia, Developmental Disabilities Preschool Teacher at Solano, wasted no time in spending her \$500 check to benefit her students with the sampling of materials shown below.

She writes: *With the generous support of the Osborn School District Education Foundation (OSDEF), our preschool classroom serving students with developmental disabilities was able to enhance our learning environment. The \$500 mini-grant was used to purchase a trampoline and a variety of sensory, STEAM, fine and gross motor materials, including sensory rice, sand tools, magnets and other tactile manipulatives. These additions have greatly expanded opportunities for our students to develop critical physical, emotional, and social skills through structured play and exploration.*
